Corrections Corner

This space is dedicated to the corrections community — and to be used as a message board to anyone interested in this type of service work.

One of the things I am trying to promote, as Area 46 Corrections Chair, is Corrections Correspondence. In a recent GSO Quarterly Report (November 2007), there was an item under the heading, **Corrections**, and this is what it said in part,

"The number of male A.A. volunteers for the Corrections Correspondence Service is dropping off again, leading to a longer waiting list for male inmates. Meanwhile, female A.A. volunteers are responding in volume to the articles in the Grapevine and/or the recent of *Box 4-5-9*, while the number of female inmates requesting the service remains small. A call will go out to all Correctional Facility Committee chairs to renew the initiative to find additional male volunteers, and to encourage applications for the service by female inmates."

I've been hearing—and seeing—this plea for some time, and it seems to me that we, collectively and/or individually, have an obligation to respond. I shared my concern in the article I submitted to the Area newsletter, the El Farolito, last month (January's issue). In that article, I said this: "Due to the fact that this request continues to be made, my brain unexpectedly gave birth to the following idea: Could an AA group maybe even a new group that had this idea as its primary purpose—take on the responsibility of doing corrections correspodence?" Clearly, there is a need for our help, and whether this becomes a group's activity or remains service work at the individual level, only time will tell. However, if you're interested, I have a slew of forms available, in both English and Spanish, if you'd like to submit your name to GSO. I just recently started correspondence with a man located in Massachusetts, and I am finding the exercise quite gratifying.

- 1. Your job now is to be at the place where you may be of maximum helpfulness to others, so never hesitate to go anywhere if you can be helpful. You should not hesitate to visit the most sordid spot on earth on such an errand. Keep on the firing line of life with these motives and God will keep you unharmed.
- 2. Unlike most of our crowd, I did not get over my craving for liquor much during the first two year and one-half years of abstinence. It was almost always with me. But at no time have I been anywhere near yielding. I used to get terribly upset when I saw my friends drink and I knew I could not, but I schooled myself to believe that though I once had the same privilege, I had abused it so frightfully that it was withdrawn. So it doesn't behoove me to squawk about it for, after all, nobody ever had to throw me down and pour liquor down my throat.
- 3. This physician had repeatedly tried spiritual means to resolve his alcoholic dilemma but had failed. But when the broker have him Dr. Silkworth's description of alcoholism and its hopelessness, the physician began to pursue the spiritual remedy for his malady with a willingness he had never before been able to muster. He sobered, never to drink again up to the moment of his death in 1950. This seemed to prove that one alcoholic could affect another as no nonalcoholic could. It also indicated that strenuous work, one alcoholic with another, was vital to permanent recovery.
- 4. I have been sober for many years now. The first few months were hard. Many things happened; business trials, little worries, and feelings of general despondency came near driving me to the bottle, but I made progress. As I go along I seem to get strength daily to be able to resist more easily. And when I get upset, cross-grained and out of tune with my fellow man I know that I am out of tune with God. Searching where I have been at fault, it is not hard to discover and get right again, for I have proven to myself and to many others who know me that God can keep a man sober if he will let Him.
- 5. This case contains a powerful lesson. Most of us have believed that if we remained sober for a long stretch, we could thereafter drink normally. But here is a man who at fifty-five years found he was just where he had left off at thirty. We have seen the truth demonstrated again and again: "Once an alcoholic, always an alcoholic." Commencing to drink after a period of sobriety, we are in a short time as bad as ever. If we are planning to stop drinking, there must be no reservation of any kind, nor any lurking notion that someday we will be immune to alcohol.
- 6. Incalculable are the intangible initiation fees that A.A. members have paid: the sick, sick hangovers, the remorse, guilt, broken homes, jails, and institutions, and the mental anguish in general that has been generated over the years. Only God as we understand Him can calculate these. But now, with His help and grace, this child of His has paid his initiation fee for good, as long as he remembers to stay away from that first drink (the one that does all the damage) one day at a time.
- 7. The harder I worked with Max, the sicker she got. So, when it ended up at the psycho ward, I wasn't all that surprised. But then, when that steel door slammed shut, and she was the one that went home, I was amazed.
