Step 4 Make a searching and fearless moral inventory of yourself.

Tradition 4 (*Short Form*) Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole.

(Long Form) With respect to its own affairs, each A.A. group should be responsible to no other authority than its own conscience. But when its plans concern the welfare of neighboring groups also, those groups ought to be consulted. And no group, regional committee, or individual should ever take any action that might greatly affect A.A. as a whole without conferring with the trustees of the General Service Board. On such issues our common welfare is paramount.

Concept 4 (*Short Form*) At all responsible levels, we ought to maintain a traditional "Right of Participation," allowing a voting representation in reasonable proportion to the responsibility that each must discharge.

(Long Form) Throughout our Conference structure, we ought to maintain at all responsible levels a traditional "Right of Participation", taking care that each classification or group of our world servants shall be allowed a voting representation in reasonable proportion to the responsibility that each must discharge.

I Start My Week with a Meeting

Sunday night I am getting ready for Monday morning and the week ahead. Before I found sobriety and the program of Alcoholics Anonymous this often meant that I actually worked. I had to take some action, sometimes even going in to work, pre-work to get ready to work. Rather than talk about my insanity I want to focus on the exact words of Step 2. In AA as the result of working the Steps I came to believe a power greater than myself could restore me to sanity. On Sunday nights I go to an AA meeting to get ready for my week ahead.

My sponsor got me in the habit of a Sunday night meeting in my first month of sobriety. What do we say? "If it ain't broke don't fix it!" So over 28 years later I still go to a meeting on Sunday night. Do I always want to? No. Am I always glad after I do? Yes. Over the years I've only gone to three different Sunday night meetings. The Sunday Night Step Study at Nativity Church mixed with the meeting at the Isleta Club, and now Dusk Patrol.

I originally switched to Dusk Patrol for convenience. It was earlier in the evening

and it was closer. I'm older now, and like Jim P. used to say, "If you want to accumulate time in AA you have to do two things. Don't drink and don't die." But I do go to bed earlier than I did in my 30s when I got sober. Dusk Patrol starts at 7:00 PM and goes for one hour. It used to be just one I-40 exit from my house; now it's a little farther. Dusk Patrol moved when Dawn Patrol moved to the exact same spot. We meet at the Harwood Methodist Church on Harwood just West off 4th Street. I knew exactly where the new meeting place was because I've gone to the El Centro group for years and it's the same location.

Dusk Patrol is a quiet, intimate meeting in a very comfortable room in the annex building. We sit in chairs and on couches, the kind that have stuffed pillows and upholstery. We follow the format and pick a topic from Conference-approved literature, and we discourage cross talk. We discuss the topic from the perspective of our own experience of what it was like, what happened and what it's like now. I like it when we have new comers and out-of-town guests. It tells me we're doing something right. My sponsor taught me that – if a group is attracting AAs with a spectrum of sobriety there's something present that people want.

I want to get my week started right, and what better way to do it than go to a meeting Sunday night.

Fight or Flight

The psychological term "fight or flight" refers to the mental and biological changes that humans (and animals) experience in response to perceived danger. When we feel threatened, our senses become acute, our heartbeats and breathing quicken, our muscles tense and we become ready to do battle or to flee.

Many alcoholics, living with the burdens of low self-esteem, a need for control, and an intense fear of failure, come to view the world as a chaotic, hostile place. Our comfort zones are extremely narrow, and when faced with unfamiliar situations, we may become paralyzed with indecision. Our "fight or flight" responses kick in, and our panic rends us even less likely to react appropriately to the uncomfortable situation or stimulus.

And this is where we live our lives. The adrenaline-fueled arousal which would ordinarily be reserved for situations such as meeting a rattlesnake or a crazed gunman is part of our everyday lives. It's unpleasant and physically draining, and we often isolate as a means of avoiding these sensations.

The Big Book is full of stories by people who felt awkward or inadequate in social settings, and discovered that alcohol offered relief. Many of us found that we could feel "normal" socially – that we could relax and converse easily – once we'd had a few drinks. After so much turmoil and self-doubt, of course we would become addicted to a substance which offered respite, especially when we found that our remorse and self-doubt when sober was increasing.

During these first few months of my sobriety, I've been most amazed by the safety that I've felt in every AA meeting. After decades of self-absorption and isolation, it has been a revelation to learn that so many others have experienced the agitation and discomfort that I thought were my experience alone.

Today I know, and feel, that I can walk into any AA meeting, let down my defenses, and not be shunned, humiliated or abused. It's astonishing to learn that these harbors exist, whenever I need them. My "fight or flight" reactions are not triggered, and I don't need to drink. That's a powerful message for me, and until I can lessen my demons through working the program, it's enough to give me that most precious commodity, hope.

"All of us felt at times that we were regaining control, but such intervals--usually brief--were inevitably followed by still less control which led in time to pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization. We are convinced to a man that alcoholics of our type are in the grip of a progressive illness. Over any Alcoholics Anonymous (Big Book), More About Alcoholism, page 30 considerable period we get worse, never better."
