Intergroup Committee Meeting Minutes

CO Intergroup Meeting Minutes July 9, 2006

David C. opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer.

Treasurer's Report – Steve H. – Current balances are good. Group contributions are good; 62 groups contributed in the first half of 2006. Literature sales are up slightly. Some expenses incurred in the move, but accounts are in the black for both the month and the year to date. July 1 marks the start of the monthly rent increase for Central Office (\$105 per month; \$1260 annually).

CO Coordinator - Michael W. - Thanks for all the support in moving the office from 1923 to 1921 Alvarado NE. Special thanks to the 30+ "enthusiastic volunteers" who came to help on June 24, and to Kathy who fed everyone well. Phones were transferred on Friday, June 23, and were up and running, with no interruption, before the move on the 24th. Call volume is strong, about 1100 calls. Summer months are typically the heaviest call months. Kathy has been covering a number of weekend shifts, and about 1 out of every 3 shifts was worked by a substitute. A number of Sunday shifts are open, along with several early morning and evening shifts during the week. Call Central Office for details. Money will have to be spent on new phones. A smaller copy machine is needed, and "the old monster" has been donated to "Clothes Helping Kids". Archives moved as well, to a space 40% smaller than what they're used to; no rent increase is anticipated for Archives due to their loss of space. The landlord has installed a new security door, an on-demand water heater, and other amenities. Everyone's still adjusting to the smaller space. It's still a period of adjustment but we're out of the old offices completely and now Central Office is back to where it started 31 years ago, in 1975: 1921 Alvarado NE.

Alternate CO Coordinator – Kathy H. – Nothing else to report; still working on the transition from the move.

Member-At-Large/Secretary – Martha – Al-Anon Convention, August 25-27, 2006, at the Madonna Center on the west side. Several slots remain open for groups to take AA meetings to the Al-Anon convention: Friday, 6:15 - 7:30 pm; Saturday, 9:00-10:15 am; and Sunday, 8:45- 9:45 am. Call Martha at 804-2852 for further details. Martha will make some Convention flyers available at Central Office.

Pass It On – Sally G. – Carol from Isleta Club noted a correction to minutes in July issue: Speaker at October 21 meeting will be Richard M. (not Ralph M.). Carol also liked the idea of a "Corrections Corner" in Pass It On.

Public Information – Alix – Nothing to report.

Schedule Editor – Al J. – Schedules are published when they run out. Next anticipated publication in early August; try to get any changes/additions in no later than the 30th of July.

Non-AA Speakers – Don S. – Not present.

Special Needs – Trish – Trish will be attending the District 3 meeting on service (July 29, Isleta Club, 2-5pm) to present on the guide lines of special needs, and how that begins in the Home Group.

Media Librarian/Web Guardian – Tom C. – Website has been receiving many bulletin board suggestions/contributions. Pass It On is available through the site; schedule is up to date. Always looking for volunteers. Surplus spare tapes will be distributed as freebies to clubs. Hugh commented that some people visiting from out of town commented on the usefulness and design of the website ("the best they've ever seen").

Traditions Checklist

from the AA Grapevine

Tradition Eight: Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

- 1. Is my behavior accurately described by the Traditions? If not, what needs changing?
- 2. When I chafe about any particular Tradition, do I realize how it affects others?
- 3. Do I sometimes try to get *some* reward—even if not money—for my personal AA efforts?
- 4. Do I try to sound in AA like an expert on alcoholism? On recovery? On medicine? On sociology? On AA itself? On psychology? On spiritual matters? Or, heaven help me, even on *humility*?
- 5. Do I make an effort to understand what AA employees do? What workers in other alcoholism agencies do? Can I distinguish clearly among them?
- 6. In my own AA life, have I any experience which illustrates the wisdom of this Tradition?
- 7. Have I paid enough attention to the book *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*? To the pamphlet *AA Tradition—How It Developed*?

I had a reel to reel tape deck and we would have an open meeting, and listen to a tape. After a while we met in Ken's place and still had the pot luck in a home. The fourth member was Cecil K. (deceased) and the 5th one was Ralph G. (deceased). We soon grew to where we had to find a bigger place. And we have met where we are for over 20 years. Some of the old ones that help get it started and are no longer with us was Cal C. and Marie C., Troy and Eloise K., Poula S, Ross B, Andy M, and Ethel H, Pete W, Charlie C. WE didn't register with GSO until January of 1968 as we wanted to see if we were going to be a group. Marie named it Happy Valley as she said we were a bunch of happy people meeting in the valley. There were some strong members when we got started and they done what was to be done, as we have been Submitted by Jimmy D. Sober date 5/22/58 meeting this long.
