Should We Have Open Carry Guns in AA Meetings?

Here in Albuquerque, New Mexico, several AA groups have been wrestling with the issue of allowing "open carry" guns and weapons in the meetings. By some, this has been called an "outside issue", stating that the only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking.

In my (not so humble) opinion, fundamental safety in an AA meeting is not an outside issue. An AA meeting must be perceived by those attending, and by the community at large, as a safe place.

The visual image of a gun on a hip does not help create that impression. A visible gun does what is intended - it intimidates. In a place offering safety, recovery, and healing to people who come to AA with all sorts of trauma, anger, emotional instability, and trouble, the visual presence of loaded weapons on belts, coupled with statements of explosive anger by people carrying those guns as I have heard in group sharing, creates a less than "safe" environment of recovery.

We in AA need to hold a place of safety and neutrality for people who arrive in states of fear, confusion, desperation, and anger, as was done for me when I arrived 31 years ago.

Our primary purpose in AA is not the 2nd amendment. It is to stay sober and help other alcoholics achieve sobriety.

To me, it seems self serving in the extreme that the folks in-

sisting on their right to open carry cannot consider the impact of that on other alcoholics --- many of them victims of gun violence and abuse --- and to have the common courtesy to respect the first tradition, "our common welfare should come first..."

Apparently, this issue has surfaced in other states. In one case, a shooting did occur, and the resultant news headlines, "Shooting at AA meeting" did nothing to help AA as a whole, creating negative impressions both inside and outside the AA community.

"It can't happen here" is a common aspect of denial. Opening the door to emotionally unstable people to carry weapons is a slippery slope. Earlier in my sobriety in California, I had a guy, unprovoked, pull a knife and directly threaten me, up close. We were able to talk him down, amidst comments that he was "just a crazy guy". Well, the incident speaks for itself. Add a gun to that scenario.

If this is an issue for a group conscience, then so be it. Inadvertently creating a safe haven for the open carry of guns in AA feels like a slippery slope in a place where we are supposed to be creating a safe haven for the recovering alcoholic.

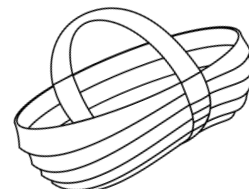
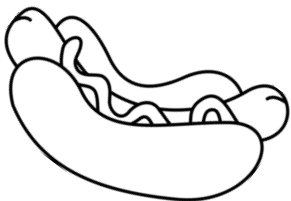

Tradition Eight

1. Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
2. Is my own behavior accurately described by the Traditions? If not, what needs changing?
3. When I chafe about any particular Tradition, do I realize how it affects others?
4. Do I sometimes try to get some reward-even if not money-for my personal AA efforts?
5. Do I try to sound in AA like an expert on alcoholism? On recovery? On medicine? On sociology? On AA itself? On psychology? On spiritual matters? Or, heaven help me, even on humility?
6. Do I make an effort to understand what AA employees do? What workers in other alcoholism agencies do? Can I distinguish clearly among them?
7. In my own AA life, have I any experiences which illustrate the wisdom of this Tradition?
8. Have I paid enough attention to the book Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions? To the pamphlet AA Tradition-How It Developed?

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Tradition Eight

Long Form: Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional. We define professionalism as the occupation of counseling alcoholics for fees or hire. But we may employ alcoholics where they are going to perform those services for which we may otherwise have to engage non-alcoholics. Such special services may be well recompensed. But our usual A.A. "12th Step" work is never to be paid for.

Meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer at 2:00.

Introductions.

Reports

Secretary: Ginger B. read June's IG meeting minutes. Motion to accept minutes was made by Betty P., 2nd by Paul C. Unanimously accepted.

Treasurer: Aaron was filling in for Tom who is on vacation. We are slightly off from the current month last year, though gross income increased from the same month last year; total expenses were down compared to last year, and year to date expenses are down. We are in the black this month. Year-to-date in the red by \$2,900, although last year this time, we were down by \$4,200. Monthly expenses average \$6,000 per month. We would like to have three-months of expenses in our Prudent Reserve, which is \$18,000. Right now, PR is at \$10,000. Motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Paul C., 2nd by Debra K. Unanimously accepted.

Coordinator: Michael said that contributions are on the upswing. We transferred Web contributions of \$50 to the bank. The East Mountain picnic raised over \$700 in proceeds for Central Office – this will show on next month's financials. Individual contributions were down last month, but were higher than this time last year. The meeting schedule page was down due to a glitch with the server, but all is well now. We are currently down on our stock of Big Book's but will purchase more this week. We received over 500 phone calls at the desk in June.

UNM School of Medicine is looking for an AA speaker. We have one and Jeff C. was asked to work with this person.

Alternate Coordinator: Debra K. Reviewed the service report. 12-Step calls were up this month. Purchases were down some. We have 43 regular desk workers, down from last month. 99% of the week days/nights were covered. Michael and Debra worked 21 shifts, mostly due to vacations. There are two new f/t regular volunteers and a trainee for evening substitute.

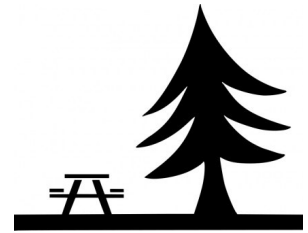

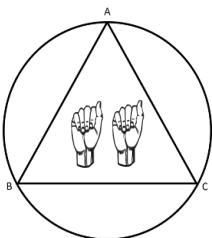

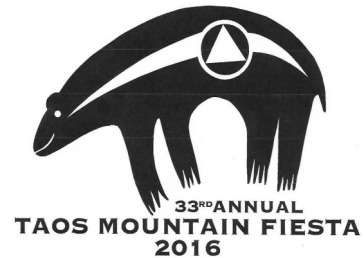
