Recovery

Step Eight: Made a list of all persons we had harmed and became willing to make amends to them all

Unity

Tradition 8(Short Form): Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

(Long Form): Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional. We define professionalism as the occupation of counseling alcoholics for fees or hire. But we may employ alcoholics where they are going to perform those services for which we may otherwise have to engage nonalcoholics. Such special services may be well recompensed. But our usual A.A. "12th Step" work is never to be paid for.

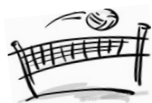

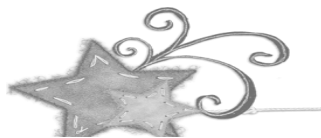

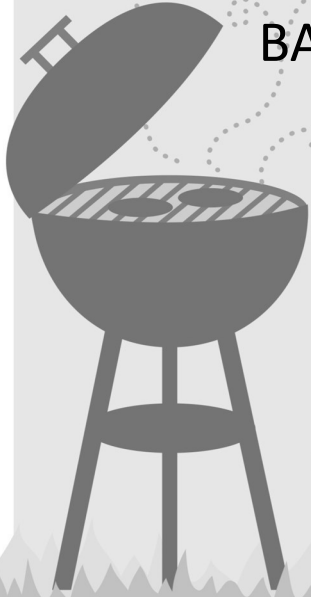

Intergroup Meeting Minutes, July 9, 2017

BrownBaggers Meeting Space

At 2:15, Acting-Chair, Ginger B., opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer.

Secretary’s Report: Ginger allowed some time for everyone to read the June minutes in the *Pass It On*, then asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the June 2017 meeting. Motion to accept made by Nancy; seconded by Lydia R.

Treasurer’s Report: Tom M. is on vacation for the summer. Aaron is filling in for Tom, and provided the report. (Full report attached to these minutes). For the six months ending June 2017: **Total revenues** are down from last year by

\$923.25; **Total Cost of Sales** are up from last year by \$962.53; **Gross Income** is down compared to last year by \$2069.19; **Total Expenses** are down by \$923.95; **Net Income** for the period \$(865.35) compared to last year at \$267.80. **The Y-T-D Net Income Comparison:** \$1,657.15 compared to last year at \$(2,940.93).

Contributions from all sources are \$1,945.45. Prudent Reserve is at \$14,007.68.

Office Coordinator, Michael W.: All is well at Central Office. Michael is very grateful for all the contributions of time and money. We have a good supply of Grapevine publications on the shelves, including two new titles. “Making Amends” and “Voices of Long-term Sobriety.” Central Office will be paying six months of CRS tax, payroll tax, and will file the 941 quarterly tax this month.

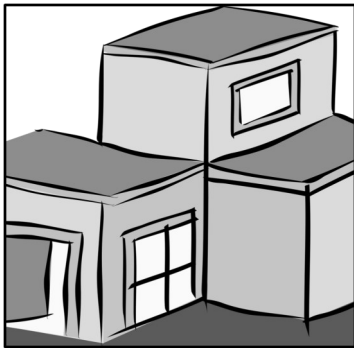
