Let us reemphasize that this reluctance to fight one another or anybody else is not counted as some special virtue which makes Nor does it mean that the members of Alcoholics Anonymous, now are going to back away from their as they see the right upon issues of our time. But when it comes to A.A. as a whole, that's quite a different matter. In this respect. we do not enter into public controversy, because we know that our Society will perish if it does. We conceive the survival and spread of Alcoholics Anonymous to be something of far greater importance than the weight we could collectively throw back of from alcoholism is life itself to us, it is imperative that we preserve in full strength our means of survival.

Maybe this sounds as though the alcoholics in A.A. had suddenly gone peaceable, and become one great big happy family. Of course, this isn't so at all. Human beings that we are, we squabble. Before we leveled off a bit, A.A. looked more like one prodigious squabble than anything else, at least on the surface. -12 Steps & 12 Traditions p177

Despite their din, our puny rows never did A.A. a particle of harm. They were just part and parcel of learning to work and live together. Let it be noted, too, that they were almost always concerned with ways to make A.A. more effective, how to do the most good for the most alcoholics.-12 Steps & 12 Traditions p178

Concept 10: "Every service" responsibility should be matched by an equal service authority—the scope of such authority to be always well defined whether by tradition, by resolution, by specific job description or by appropriate charters and bylaws."

Our service structure cannot function effectively harmoniously unless, at every level, each operational responsibility is matched by a corresponding authority to discharge it. This requires that authority must be delegated at every level—and that the responsibility and authority of every entity are well defined and clearly understood.

As we have seen (Concept I) "final responsibility and ultimate authority" reside with the A.A. groups, and they delegate this authority to the Conference (Concept II). The Conference, in turn, delegates to the General Service Board the authority to manage A.A.'s affairs (Concept III) in its behalf. The board is in authority over its subsidiary conditions—A.A. operating World Services, Inc. and the A.A. Grapevine, Inc.—but /it delegates to the directors of those corporations the authority necessary to run these service entities. The directors are in authority over the executives of the corporations, but delegate to these officers the authority needed to carry our their administrative responsibilities. And finally, the executives *delegate* to the G.S.O. and Grapevine staff members and other employees the authority necessary to carry out their important service jobs.

"It is perfectly clear," says Bill, "that when delegated authority is operating well, it should not be constantly interfered with."

THE CENTRAL OFFICE MEDIA LIBRARY EXTREME MAKEOVER!

Did you know that the Central office has a media library of speaker CD's and other related AA CD's and DVD's? Did you also know that you may check out the media for a month for a \$2 deposit per disk? If you have used this library before, do you know it has been rearranged by a number system and there is now a catalog to help you find what you want. The catalog is in three parts, the first being by speaker or title arranged alphabetically, the second section is by theme, such as men, women, archive etc. and the third is by numerical order (all disks are now numbered for ease in retrieving). The catalog part by speaker name is included in this PIO (opposite page). Also all groups who send a representative to intergroup should have a copy of the part of the catalog, sorted by speaker name. But these catalogs will become out of date very quickly due to library additions. To have the most up to date catalog, the catalog will be posted on the web site (albuqurqueaa.org) or the catalog at the Central Office will be updated as necessary. The web site and Central Office catalogs will be the only ones updated in the foreseeable future.

Due to the need to protect the members anonymity, we only ask that those checking out disks put down their first name on the check out slip. Many who check out disks do not return them, which means they have bought them for \$2. This does not impact the Central Office financially since a blank disk costs a lot less. We actually make a little money when you do that. But we wish that you would not do this for the following reasons. One, if you don't return the disk after thirty days, we give you a few more weeks to return it, before burning a new copy. Then it will be a few weeks before we get around to burning the new copy. This means the disk will be unavailable to others that may want to check it out for several months. Second, we who do this work are service volunteers, and it takes a lot of time to burn a lot of disks. So please try and return your disks within 30 days.




