## **Step 10:** *"Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it."*

This thought brings us to Step Ten, which suggests we continue to take personal inventory and continue to set right any new mistakes as we go along. We vigorously commenced this way of living as we cleaned up the past. We have entered the world of the Spirit. Our next function is to grow in understanding and effectiveness. This is not an overnight matter. It should continue for our lifetime. Continue to watch for selfishness, dishonesty, resentment, and fear. When these crop up, we ask God at once to remove them. We discuss them with someone immediately and make amends quickly if we have harmed anyone. Then we resolutely turn our thoughts to someone we can help. Love and tolerance of others is our code.

As we work the first nine Steps, we prepare ourselves for the adventure of a new life. But when we approach Step Ten we commence to put our A.A. way of living to practical use, day by day, in fair weather or foul. Then comes the acid test: can we stay sober, keep in emotional balance, and live to good purpose under all conditions?

It is a spiritual axiom that every time we are disturbed, no matter what the cause, there is something wrong *with us*. If somebody hurts us and we are sore, we are in the wrong also.

Such wonderful, clear-cut directions are available to us for working the 10th Step. Learning that it isn't about a constant state of morbid reflection, but a means of interacting with our fellows right now, makes the idea of "our next function" a joy to ponder.

## **Tradition 10:** *"Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy."*

Let us reemphasize that this reluctance to fight one another or anybody else is not counted as some special virtue which makes us feel superior to other people. Nor does it mean that the members of Alcoholics Anonymous, now restored as citizens of the world, are going to back away from their individual responsibilities to act as they see the right upon issues of our time. But when it comes to A.A. as a whole, that's quite a different matter. In this respect, we do not enter into public controversy, because we know that our Society will perish if it does. We conceive the survival and spread of Alcoholics Anonymous to be something of far greater importance than the weight we could collectively throw back of any other cause. Since recovery from alcoholism is life itself to us, it is imperative that we preserve in full strength our means of survival.

Maybe this sounds as though the alcoholics in A.A. had suddenly gone peaceable, and become one great big happy family. Of course, this isn't so at all. Human beings that we are, we squabble. Before we leveled off a bit, A.A. looked more like one prodigious squabble than anything else, at least on the surface. *-12 Steps & 12 Traditions p177*

Despite their din, our puny rows never did A.A. a particle of harm. They were just part and parcel of learning to work and live together. Let it be noted, too, that they were almost always concerned with ways to make A.A. more effective, how to do the most good for the most alcoholics. *-12 Steps & 12 Traditions p178*

## **Concept 10:** *"Every service responsibility should be matched by an equal service authority—the scope of such authority to be always well defined whether by tradition, by resolution, by specific job description or by appropriate charters and bylaws."*

Our service structure cannot function effectively and harmoniously unless, at every level, each operational responsibility is matched by a corresponding authority to discharge it. This requires that authority must be *delegated* at every level—and that the responsibility and authority of every entity are well defined and clearly understood.

As we have seen (Concept I) "final responsibility and ultimate authority" reside with the A.A. groups, and they *delegate* this authority to the Conference (Concept II). The Conference, in turn, *delegates* to the General Service Board the authority to manage A.A.'s affairs (Concept III) in its behalf. The board is in authority over its subsidiary operating conditions—A.A. World Services, Inc. and the A.A. Grapevine, Inc.—but it *delegates* to the directors of those corporations the authority necessary to run these service entities. The directors are in authority over the executives of the corporations, but delegate to these officers the authority needed to carry out their administrative responsibilities. And finally, the executives *delegate* to the G.S.O. and Grapevine staff members and other employees the *authority* necessary to carry out their important service jobs.

"It is perfectly clear," says Bill, "that when *delegated authority is operating well, it should not be constantly interfered with.*"

## THE CENTRAL OFFICE MEDIA LIBRARY EXTREME MAKEOVER!

Did you know that the Central office has a media library of speaker CD's and other related AA CD's and DVD's? Did you also know that you may check out the media for a month for a \$2 deposit per disk? If you have used this library before, do you know it has been rearranged by a number system and there is now a catalog to help you find what you want. The catalog is in three parts, the first being by speaker or title arranged alphabetically, the second section is by theme, such as men, women, archive etc. and the third is by numerical order (all disks are now numbered for ease in retrieving ). The catalog part by speaker name is included in this PIO (opposite page). Also all groups who send a representative to intergroup should have a copy of the part of the catalog, sorted by speaker name. But these catalogs will become out of date very quickly due to library additions. To have the most up to date catalog, the catalog will be posted on the web site (albuquerqueaa.org) or the catalog at the Central Office will be updated as necessary. The web site and Central Office catalogs will be the only ones updated in the foreseeable future.

Due to the need to protect the members anonymity, we only ask that those checking out disks put down their first name on the check out slip. Many who check out disks do not return them, which means they have bought them for \$2. This does not impact the Central Office financially since a blank disk costs a lot less. We actually make a little money when you do that. But we wish that you would not do this for the following reasons. One, if you don't return the disk after thirty days, we give you a few more weeks to return it, before burning a new copy. Then it will be a few weeks before we get around to burning the new copy. This means the disk will be unavailable to others that may want to check it out for several months. Second, we who do this work are service volunteers, and it takes a lot of time to burn a lot of disks. So please try and return your disks within 30 days.

### Corrections Corner

The District 3 Corrections Committee is looking for AA members, men and women like you, who are willing to help make it possible for the AA message to be carried to those on the "inside." Taking meetings into correctional facilities is not for everyone. Jim P. lived and breathed Step 12, but he couldn't go inside. Because of his own story of finding recovery inside the Kansas State Penitentiary, he wanted to but he couldn't stand the sound of the steel doors locking. But did you know you don't have to go inside to do corrections service work?

Now there's a rewarding and barely ever mentioned form of Twelve Step work that's "a special kind of AA service." In Corrections Correspondence AA members on the "outside" correspond with AA members in correctional facilities. Like sponsorship, it is suggested that men correspond with men and women with women.
