Step 12 Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

Tradition 12 (Short Form) Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

(Long Form) And finally we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all.

Concept 12 (Short Form) The Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government, and that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain democratic in thought and action.

(Long Form) General Warranties of the Conference: in all its proceedings, the General Service Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. Tradition, taking great care that the conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds, plus an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principal; that none of the Conference Members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any others; that all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy; that, though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government; and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action.

It's that time of the year again - NEW YEARS ALCATHON time. This year it is being held at the Heights Club from 12 noon on the 31st until 12 noon on the first. Plans include marathon meetings around the clock, an AI-Anon meeting, 2 speaker meetings, a potluck, a breakfast and a dance. The speaker meetings are at 8pm on the 31st (Speaker: Charlie W.) and 10 am on the 1st (Speaker: Alan S.). The potluck is from 7 til 8pm on the 31st and the breakfast is from 9-10am on the 1st. The dance will feature live music, be from 9pm (on the 31st) until 1am, suggested donation of \$3 for singles, \$5 for couples. The following groups are scheduled to host meetings: Dry Nooners (31st @ noon), Promises (31st @ 1:30pm), Happy Hour (31st @ 3pm), Women on Wednesday (31st @ 4:30pm), Happy Hour (31st @ 6pm), Westside (31st @ 8pm), Spark of Light (31st @ 9:30pm), Courage to Change (AI-ANON 1st @ 12:30am), Sunrise Sobriety (1st @ 6:30am), Dawn Patrol (1st @ 8am) and Fellowship Group (1st @ 11:30am). There's going to be a 50/50 raffle, with tickets being sold from the open of the Alcathon until the drawing at the end of the 10am speaker meeting on the 1st - winner need not be present to win). ITS THE HOLIDAYS AGAIN

There were many difficult times of year for me, like those times around anniversaries of death's of loved ones and those days where it felt like God took a vacation and never gave me advanced warning. But nothing equaled the dread and torture of the time between Thanksgiving and Christmas. It's called "the holidays" but it never felt like a holiday to me.

I was always haunted by memories of Christmases past. I would avoid places where they played Christmas music, which made grocery shopping tricky. Sometimes I'd ignore my feelings and throw myself into Christmas music, decorations, and all to find within a few weeks that I was in a deep depression. Oh, Yuck! Not again! Didn't we do this last year!??

Well a few years ago I found the answer for me and it was a similar one that our founders discovered. I started realizing that I wasn't alone and I started looking for ways to help my fellow alcoholics have an easier time getting through the holidays. Imagine that, thinking of someone besides "ME". Hmm. I encouraged our group to open up earlier for fellowship and snacks. Everyone thought it was a good idea but no one wanted to open that early, so I opened up, made the coffee, and brought some snacks. I started really paying attention to what my fellow's shared at the meetings. I would try to catch many of them after the meeting for a hug and a friendly smile. If they seemed to be struggling, I would ask seriously if they would like to go somewhere to have coffee and talk. If not, and usually not, at least I asked. Before long I was not noticing "my holidays" and "my" problems.

I made a lot of meetings looking for someone to cheer-up. I don't know if it worked for those I encountered, but it kept me content and sober through the holidays. Before I knew it, it was New Year's Eve and time for the Alco-thon. This is a WE-program. Together we can do what I can't seem to manage by myself. I think I heard that somewhere.

Now I go to my tool box for help. My tools are: 1. Stay in the moment, living just one breath at a time. 2. Ask my higher power for guidance and let him guide me. 3. Remember to be grateful for what I have. 4. Check in with my sponsor. 5. Make meetings. I drank every day I can certainly make meetings most days. 6. Do service work. ie help another alcoholic, help get the meeting room ready before and clean up after the meeting, plan or participate in a potluck, etc. Get in the AA wagon not on it. On it, you can fall off. And finally, 7. I have to remember HALT- don't get too hungry, angry, lonely, or tired. May you all have a sane and sober merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Treasurer's Report Total Revenues: 11,225.45 - Cost of Sales: 3,209.64 - Gross Income: 8,015.81 - Total Expenses: 5,338.87 - Net Income: 2,676.94 - Discussion regarding Treasurer's Report: Tim intergroup rep questioned why individual contributions went up some much. Michael said it was due to a large contribution from a grateful member. Aaron spoke about research he did to make it possible for members to purchase merchandise using credit cards at Central Office. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report was accepted.

Central Office Coordinator Been a quiet month as far as the phones go. We've been asked to present a workshop at NM Roundup next year. Planning has begun, but Michael hasn't gone to any organizing meetings. Focus is on the relationship between Central Office(s) in relationship Intergroup(s) and the fellowship. Has been able to block overnight calls from harasser from Georgia. AA Comes of Age out, coming this weekend. Paperback As Bill Sees It has been ordered. Almost \$3,000 spent on literature last month. Payroll tax due this week for paid positions. New desk workers are starting to work at Central Office, workers are shifting schedules. Only open shifts are Wednesday closing shift, and every other Saturday 3-6 pm, and then the other two alternating Saturdays 6-9 pm.

Alternate Central Office Coordinator Has counted information calls around 700 phone calls, that's 175 less than this time last year, though 8 more than last month. Twelve steps calls are up from 0 to 2. There are now 33 subs, but more are needed. List has been updated, 137/138 weekday shifts are covered. Last month two nights went uncovered, people who signed up to cover didn't do so. We now have a sub night shift list, hopefully to eliminate that ever happening again. Michael and Deborah 31 hours worked this last month. Deborah is scanning our Central Office history into our system. Website hits up.

Member at Large Questions regarding Member at Large Report: Information on special 75th edition book being released using the same thick paper and the original "circus book cover". Kristen: What is the time range from when the book could be ordered? Elizabeth: Nov. 15 until April 14, right before book arrives on April 15 How can we purchase it? Go to Central office to fill out order form, make payment.

Pass It On Editor Birthday submissions holding steady, would like to see more groups submitting. Article submissions still at zero. (In response to question from Jeremy)Waiting on Design Software status, Steve waiting for word back on whether we can get it for free, or if it will have to be paid for, if so he'll ask for the necessary. Jeremy: Asked whether Steve's request of district to contribute articles had been ~~granted~~ (agreed to). Steve: Said that nothing ~~at all had come of those requests~~ (has happened as of yet. Hope to have it together by January issue).

Media Librarian Library now has 260 titles. She added 16 this month Pam (old alternate coordinator for Central Office donated many titles on CDs) Says that Jerry told her about XA speakers with a lot of good speakers e.g. Ken D and Hank J. There was a problem with the copy of the movie: My Name is Bill W., it took a month to get a good copy of it, but it has been done. All is well.

Web Guardian (Nothing to report)

Schedule Editor Not much happening, planning on going to print next month with updates depending on present supply. There is little confusion in the changes that must be made on the new schedule.

Community Outreach Recruitment poster for inpatient treatment center Michael explained to him that that is not how AA runs, no further inquiries from the man. Steve suggested that they might be able to post on Non-AA related boards at clubs. Albuquerque Job Corps called interested in starting a meeting open to public. (Chyna B said she'd be willing to help, ask her) Michael will not be attending meeting he doesn't want them to get the impression that he will shoulder the start of the meeting, he will help them get started on their own as that is his responsibility.


